1.)How do I get my event Sanction?

To get your event sanction just Go to our website and click on <u>sanction form</u> and follow the instructions,

2.)What does KBMA SANCTION cost?

The fee to get an event sanction is from <u>1A Rated \$80</u> – <u>2A Rated \$95</u> – <u>3A Rated \$120</u> – <u>4A Rated \$155</u> – <u>5A Rated \$200</u> There is also a \$100 data entry fee to enter all the event date (competitors and division winners).

To pay for a sanction event you can send a check or money order payable to K.B.M.A. Or you can call with your credit card or debit card - Visa, Master Card

The \$100.00 data entry fee needs to be paid the day of your event to the (data entry person)

3.) What are my duties when signing up for KBMA Sanction?

You must collect your competitor's information in detail, KBMA needs the competitor's; full name, date of birth, and address (email and phone number are optional). We suggest making copies of division winner sheets. You can get them from us.

4.)What is a delinquent event?

This is when you have not sent in your data (competitor's info and division winners) to us within 10 days after your tournament.

Competitor's take competing in KBMA Tournaments seriously. Being a KBMA champion is a prestigious title. Tournaments that do not send in their results in a timely manner risk losing a committed competitor, and the ability to hold KBMA events in the future. Please be considerate towards your competitors and the martial arts community, get your results in on time.

If an event is delinquent, they will be contacted and given one week (unless other arrangements are made) to send in their data. If they fall to send in the data they will be reviewed and possibly banned from involvement with KBMA.
